<p style="text-align: center;">If you are un-vaccinated...</p> <p style="text-align: center;">You MUST stay home 14 days after your last exposure to the positive case</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">If you are vaccinated...</p> <p style="text-align: center;">If you are vaccinated, no quarantine is required; however, it is recommended that you get tested 3-5 days and 7—10 days following your exposure.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">AND</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Continue to wear a mask, social distance, and avoid large gatherings.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Tested positive for COVID-19?</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Here are your Isolation Guidelines in accordance with KDHE</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">You MUST stay home and away from others for 14 days from onset of symptoms (or positive test if asymptomatic)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">AND</p> <p style="text-align: center;">You MUST be symptom free without medication for 72-hours before leaving isolation, whichever is longer.</p>

Chautauqua County Health Department is working diligently to slow the spread of COVID-19 within our county. It is a requirement from KDHE that our agency conducts all contact tracing for positive COVID-19 cases. Contact tracing includes isolating persons with a positive COVID-19 test, as well as, quarantining close contacts of the positive individual.
